PROFILE: George Steele, FRMS WebMaster

eorge Steele has been a member of the FRMS Committee since October 2006. He quickly became the photographer for FRMS events and in 2007 took on the role of WebMaster. In that capacity he has completely redesigned and revitalised the FRMS website making it a valuable source of information for affiliates and members.

George has been an active member of Rochdale Gramophone Society for 12 years and is a past Chairman of that Society. He is a keen photographer and is President elect of Bury Photographic Society.

George also has a very busy talks season, visiting both recorded music societies and photographic societies. If you want to know how to improve your



photography, or to prove that the camera can often lie by moving objects, removing blots on your landscape or changing the background to your picture, then George is your man.

If you have internet access the FRMS website will provide you with plenty of information about other affiliated societies, inform you about national and regional activities and it will provide you with links to related sites, e.g. radio stations with classical output and information about leading music publications. And all this is freely available at no charge!

MUSIC MATTERS (3)

y thoughts have recently been concentrating on British Music. I wondered just how much attention we pay to our own composers. To answer my own question I chose twelve societies at random and had a look at their programmes on the FRMS Website. What I found there was much more encouraging than I had expected.

Of the twelve societies, six had at least one programme that was wholly devoted to the work of one British composer or were exclusively of works by domestic composers. (Four societies had no all-British programmes and two societies did not offer any information about their programme plans, past, present or future – now that latter fact is a cause for concern – and I now realise that there are many more societies like this).

Whilst I have great affection and reverence for the work of Bach, Beethoven and Brahms, and Mahler and Mozart, I also like to support the home team. We need more programmes that feature the music of, for example, Bax, Bantock, Bliss and Boughton. Or you could be more adventurous and explore the music of Alwyn, Arnold, Bridge or Britten - and I'm sure you've noticed that I have only partially covered two letters of the alphabet so far. The intention is to spread awareness and increase appreciation of our own musical heritage.

There is a wealth of material immediately available, particularly on the Chandos and Hyperion labels, promoted by conductors such as the late lamented Vernon Handley and the equally lamented Richard Hickox. They have left us a great legacy and it is up to us to explore it, to enjoy it and to make use of it.

Let me take just one example: Sir George Dyson (1883-1964). His Canterbury Pilgrims is a two-CD set, so perhaps a little long to include all of it in a programme, but that doesn't stop you including some of its little gems. You can laugh at and with The Wife of Bath, a most jolly but very shrewd character, or just revel in the sheer, simple beauty of the music and words used to describe The Poor Parson of a Town. How many people have heard this music or even heard of the composer? He was Director of the Royal College of Music, wrote a Symphony and Violin Concerto and he was an expert on hand-grenades.

I don't expect a flurry of all-British music because that would not lead to well-balanced programmes and it would lose sight of the many fine composers from other countries. But it would be encouraging to have a few more *British is Best* days.
