# LYNDON JENKINS, 1938-2014

It is with deep regret that we record the death on 24th April of the FRMS President, Lyndon Jenkins. Lyndon accepted the presidency in 2009 in succession to Edward Greenfield and it soon became clear that he was not content to be a mere figurehead. He sat in on many meetings of the committee, making valuable suggestions, and was a very great help in planning the Daventry Weekends.

Inevitably his passing – and that of our Chairman, Colin Dancer, less than six months earlier – cast a shadow over this year's Daventry Weekend in which he had been due to take part. But with some rearrangement of the programme the event went ahead and was regarded as a tribute to Lyndon and to Colin, both of whom had played a part in its organisation and who would, we are sure, have felt that "the show must go on."

Lyndon was Music Adviser at Symphony Hall, Birmingham and an obituary tribute from Symphony Hall appears on the FRMS website. A fuller tribute will be published in the FRMS *Bulletin*, but here we would like to record a few of the spontaneous tributes from people who knew him.
